### PLACE ROYALE DU PEYROU

The backdrop for the statue of King Louis XIV on horseback, it forms a straight line with the Arc de Triomphe, the water tower and the Saint-Clément Aqueduct.

SAINT-CLÉMENT AQUEDUCT Engineer Henri Pitot de Launay was inspired by the **Pont du** Gard when he built the Saint-Clément Aqueduct in 1754. It 14 K10 allowed **drinking water** to be supplied from the springs in the town of Saint-Clément.

### WATER TOWER

This waterworks, built by Giral in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, at the same time as the aqueduct, contained the water reserves which were supplied for free in the city. from 1851.

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
